





Aaron Siskind Foundation's Individual Photographer's Fellowship

The Aaron Siskind Foundation's Individual Photographer's Fellowship grant is awarded to artists working with photography or photo-based art. With this specific grant you must be 21 years or older and a U.S. citizen. The 2016 winners include Sam Contis, Holly Lynton, Raymond Meeks, RaMell Ross, Bryan Schutmaat and Danny Wilcox Frazier.

Carmignac Gestion Photojournalism Award



The Carmignac Gestion Photojournalism Award is presented to photojournalists from around the world who want to pursue a long-term reportage project. Themes can range from focusing on an internal conflict, advocating for peace or social justice, or highlighting a gradual change within a nation.

The award is between \$5,000 and \$10,000 and sometimes presented to multiple photographers. To be eligible, you must be a U.S. citizen and nominated based on your professional accomplishments. Previous recipients include Suné Woods and Dru Donovan.

The Manuel Rivera-Ortiz Foundation for Documentary Photography and Film

This grant from The Manuel Rivera-Ortiz Foundation for Documentary Photography and Film enables documentary photographers and filmmakers to receive funding for their projects. The cash award is \$5,000 for non-fiction works based on social issues such as health, poverty, oppression, war, famine or religious/political persecution. The 2016 Photography Grant recipients were Ismail Ferdous for his work on human exploitation, working conditions and corporate responsibility in Bangladesh, and Enri Canaj for his work on human flight and refugee resettlement in Germany and Greece.

The W. Eugene Smith Grant is awarded in honor of the late prolific photo essayist Eugene Smith. The award is to recognize exemplary talent and vision in documentary photography that highlights the human condition. The 2016 recipient was Justyna Mielnikiewicz for her project "A Diverging Frontier," a look at what life is like for Russians living in the former Soviet states.

VSCO Artist Initiative



The popular app and social network has created a \$1 million grant to provide photographers with funds and resources to pursue their creative vision. Since its inception, the <u>VSCO Artist Initiative</u> has awarded photographers with grants of varying sizes, which is determined at the discretion of VSCO. Applicants must be VSCO members.

The Imagely Fund, previously known as the Photocrati Fund, provides grants to pro and emerging photographers focusing on humanitarian or environmental projects all over the world. Unlike many grants that are awarded on the basis of photography alone, Imagely also considers how a photographer's background and training has prepared him or her for the project. The 2016 judges were Art Wolfe, Jim Brandenburg and Steve Winter.

In addition to the cash award, the winner will be invited to participate in several exhibitions, receive a Lenscratch publication and more. Johnny Miller was the 2017 recipient with his project titled <u>Unequal Scenes</u>.

CENTER's <u>Project Development Grant</u> provides financial support to fine art, documentary or photojournalist works-in-progress. David Denil was the 2017 recipient with his project titled Let Us Not Fall Asleep While Walking.




Dorothea Lange-Paul Taylor Prize

April AWARD \$10,000 FEE \$65


Duke University administers the Dorothea Lange-Paul Taylor Prize, which seeks to encourage "the interplay of words and images in the creation and presentation of [a photographer's work." The rules no longer require a separate photographer and writer collaboration, although teams are still allowed. The progressive prize now accepts audio, video and graphic novels for consideration. To be considered, applicants must show that they have already begun fieldwork.

Lucie Foundation Emerging Scholarship



The <u>Lucie Foundation</u> supports emerging photographers with a grant to work on a "specific, dynamic project." The foundation doesn't restrict applicants to any specific subgenre of photography, preferring to support work that is "gripping and original."

Ian Parry Scholarship



Photojournalist Ian Parry was killed at age 24 covering the downfall of Nicolae Ceausescu during the Romanian revolution. His namesake scholarship is divided into two categories: The Award for Achievement and The Award for Potential. Each recipient receives £3,500 toward a chosen assignment plus Canon camera gear, and their work will be part of the The Incite Project's collection, among other rewards.

Tim Hetherington Fellowship

The Tim Hetherington Trust joined with World Press Photo to offer this fellowship in 2016 (previously The Tim Hetherington Grant). It provides funds to a visual journalist to finalize a project with a human rights theme. The fellowship is open to filmmakers and photographers alike, honoring the award-winning work of Tim Hetherington, a journalist who was killed in Libya in 2011.

Gomma Photography Grant

Gomma has been working to promote photographers since its Gomma Magazine launch in 2004. The Gomma Photography Grant has several prize categories and is open to all genres. Past winners include Esa Ylijaasko and Harit Srikhao.

The Pulitzer Center



The Pulitzer Center has multiple grants: Student Travel Grants, Persephone Miel Fellowship, The Catalyst Fund and the main travel grants fund. The focus of the program is on international issues that are underreported in American media. Applicants must show a distribution plan and have editors or producers interested in publishing their work. Multimedia projects and collaborations are highly encouraged.

Inge Morath Award

Established by the members of <u>Magnum Photos</u>, the annual <u>Inge Morath Award</u> is presented to a female photographer under 30 who shows exemplary prowess in the documentary photography field. The award is a means to fund a long-term documentary project and is awarded each <u>July/August</u>. 
PhotogrVphy Grant's tagline is "searching and exposing new talents in photography." Their main focus is supporting upcoming photographers in finding their voice and bringing a "fresh approach" to the photography field. Drew Nikonowicz, the 2016 grant recipient, previously won the 2015 Lenscratch Student Prize and the 2015 Aperture Portfolio Prize, and exhibited his work at the Museum of Contemporary Art of Rome.

Save Our Seas Foundation

The Save Our Seas Foundation has been working to protect our oceans by supporting projects that have research, conservation or education as key components, and focus on the ocean or the health of marine life. There are three grant categories with different submission deadlines and projects ranging from a timeline of three weeks and \$2,000 in funding to a three-year timeline with up to \$100,000 in funding.

Howard Chapnick Grant



Part of the Eugene Smith Memorial Fund, the <u>Howard Chapnick Grant</u> was started in 1996 to honor the contributions by Howard Chapnick to the photography community. Funds may be used for research, education, internships, etc., but may not be used "for the creation or production of photographs." Past recipients include Liza Faktor, Tom Garber and Muriel Hasbun.

Firecracker Photographic Grant


The Firecracker Photographic Grant, founded by Fiona Rogers, supports the work of European women in the documentary photography genre. In addition to the £2,000 grant, Firecracker will also pay for professional printing, mounting and framing services from Genesis Imaging.

The PHM Women Photographers Grant

October GRANT 1st Prize: £5,000 2nd Prize: £2,000 3rd Prize: £1,000 FEE \$25

The Women Photographers Grant is presented by The Photographic Museum of Humanity. As a curated photography platform, the museum also selects members to contribute to online gallery spaces monthly and produces a mobile exhibition that travels around South America every year. Jurors for the grant include Martin Parr from Magnum and Kathy Ryan from *The New York Times*.

Invisible Photographer Asia (IPA) Scholarship Grant Program



Founded by Kevin WY Lee in 2010, Invisible Photographer Asia is an organization providing educational workshops, programs and events. The Scholarship Grant Program doesn't cover travel costs, only the workshop fee, but it has chosen 40+ winners since 2010.



Presented by the <u>Henri Cartier-Bresson Foundation</u>, this award is open to photographers with "an approach close to that of documentary" and is awarded every other year. Former award winners include Larry Towell, Josef Koudelka and Chris Killip, and most recently Guy Tillim — in other words, competition is stiff, but the prize is large.





Women Photograph + ONA




Women Photograph teamed up with ONA, maker of fine leather bags and accessories for creatives, to offer three \$2,500 grants to female, female-identifying and non-binary documentary photographers from all over the world. Women Photograph also keeps an organized database of photographers, their specialties and the regions where they're based to offer to creative industry professionals interested in hiring female photographers. It's part of their overall initiative to diversify the photojournalistic voices we hear from.

Magenta Foundation's Flash Forward Emerging Photographer Project Grant



The Magenta Foundation's Flash Forward Emerging Photographer Project Grant is part of the foundation's annual competition—submissions to the competition are eligible for the grant. The grant money can be used for any project not yet completed for any type of photography. Past recipients include Jake Naughton and Maya Fuhr.

Photoville's The FENCE Grant




The FENCE is a large-scale photography exhibition traveling to 9+ U.S. cities and reaching over 4 million visitors. The grant is intended to fund the production or development of the recipient's project which will be featured with a solo exhibition. Recipients will also receive a Leica camera package and other support and promotions—totaling over \$20,000 in value.


